
WOMEN'S DAY

I am a mother of 2 children (8 years old boy and 6 years old girl) and just started my second career as a Japanese teacher at Japanese language school after working at a Japanese company for 10 years. Mainly, my students are the people who want to go to universities or vocational schools in Japan after learning Japanese for 2 years. Being in the multicultural class is very exciting for me. I teach them Japanese, but at the same time. I learn their cultural differences and diversities as well. My first encounter of English was at age the of 13. Let's enjoy the cultural exchange together and make our world smaller!!
